




Jubilee Field Dog Options Survey Results

Next Steps

Axminster Town Council's overall drive is to create a new and inclusive parkland area.

We are talking with local landscape companies and will choose a suitable partner within the next few weeks.

The initial objectives is to create the list below in time for The Queen's Platinum Jubilee weekend in June.

- Pathway all around the field, including Boxfield Road entrance
- Additional fenced area as per Option 1
- Benches and picnic tables
- Jubilee Oak Tree planted
- Coppice/shrub areas
- Clear signage to stress the rules of the field
- Other trees as available and before March in line with planting plan

Follow-on phases will be communicated in the Spring of 2022.
