Flowers

Please place any flowers in respect of the HM Queen Elizabeth II along the Southern wall of the Minster Church (facing the Old Courthouse).

Flowers will remain there until the day after the Funeral (D+11) at 11am.

We respectfully ask that all floral tributes laid have any plastic or cellophane removed beforehand.

Please do not lay non-floral tributes along the Minster wall such as candles, artwork, ornaments or soft toys.

Flags and Proclamations

The Town Council's Union Flag at the Guildhall is flying at half-mast currently (9th September 2022)

The Proclamation will be read in London on Saturday 10th at 11am whereupon the flag will be raised to masthead and then returned to half-mast at 13.00hrs on Sunday 11th.

A further proclamation will take place at County hall on Sunday at 13.05, and again at Blackdown House, Honiton at 10.00 on Monday 12th.

At 12 noon on the 12th September, the Mayor of Axminster, Cllr. Jill Farrow, accompanied by the Town Crier, made the following proclamation to those assembled outside the Minster Church, Axminster:

“ Whereas it has pleased Almighty God to call to his mercy our late Sovereign, Lady Queen Elizabeth the Second of blessed and glorious memory, by whose decease the Crown of the United Kingdom, of Great Britain and Northern Ireland is solely, and rightfully, come to the Prince Charles Philip Arthur George.

We, therefore, the lords - spiritual and temporal - of this realm, and Members of the House of Commons, together with other members of Her late Majesty’s Privy Council, and representatives of the realms and territories, aldermen, and citizens of London and others, do now hereby, with one voice, and consent of tongue and heart, publish and proclaim that the Prince Charles Philip Arthur George, is now, by the death of our late Sovereign of happy memory, become our only lawful and rightful liege lord, Charles III, by the grace of God, of the United Kingdom, of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, and his other realms and territories; King, Head of the Commonwealth, Defender of the Faith, to whom we do acknowledge all faith and obedience with humble affection, beseeching God, by whom kings and queens do reign, to bless His Majesty with long and happy years to reign over us.”

Given at St. James’s Palace this tenth day of September in the year of Our Lord, two thousand and twenty-two.

God Save The King.

The Town Crier then led those assembled in three cheers for King Charles.

There then followed a 2-minute silence in memory of her late Majesty The Queen.

Finally, the Town Crier led the singing of the National Anthem - "God save the King"

There was a Service of Commemoration on Sunday 18th September at 10.30am at the Minster Church. All were welcome. Order of Service is attached as an appendix to this document.

Additionally, there was a "Moment of Reflection" at 8pm outside of the Minster that same evening to observe a minute's silence and to reflect upon the life and service of Her late Majesty Queen Elizabeth II.

The Town Council offices were closed on the day of the State Funeral – 19th September 2022

constancy through 70 years of change. We will remember Her late Majesty
with affection and gratitude and silently give thanks in our hearts for her
